




















Example of how this applies to an investor

Sam had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sam received a return, after fund charges were deducted, of \$2,421 (that is 24.21% of his initial \$10,000). Sam also paid \$0 in other charges. This gives Sam a total return after tax of \$2,421 for the year.
